\*Locally grown food tastes better and is better for you. Studies have shown that the average distance food travels in this country from farm to plate is 1,500 miles. Food that travels this far loses quality and nutrients. By purchasing from a local farm, you're buying the freshest 'just picked' product available.

\*Local farms and forests protect our environment. The farms and forests of the Catskills keep our water clean, protect wildlife habitat, and open space. By supporting them with your purchase, you help to ensure a vibrant agricultural landscape into the future.

\*Purchasing from local farms and businesses supports the local economy. Farmers in turn spend their income locally. Studies show that every dollar spent at a local farm turns over in the local economy about 2.5 times – more than any other industry!

\*Agriculture helps keep your taxes in check. Studies in the region have shown that for every dollar a farm pays in property taxes, local government spends about 50 -80 cents in services. For every dollar spent on residential taxes, local government spends on average \$1.25 in services!

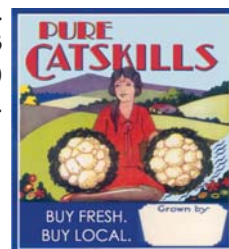

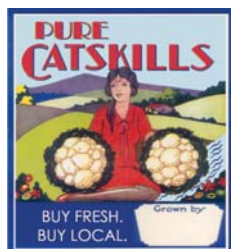

Cut racks in half. Grill outdoors or bake at 375 for 40 minutes or till done. Separate ribs. Toss with your favorite BBQ sauce and sear at high heat. Enjoy!

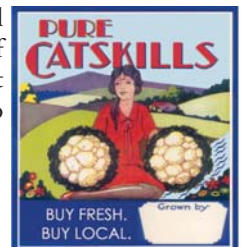

The farm follows the Natural Agriculture method taught by the Japanese organization Shumei. The principle of Natural Agriculture is an over-riding respect and concern for nature. Fertilizers, insecticides, and chemical soil treatments are never used. Only naturally occurring nutrients enrich the soil. Compost is not used as a nutrient but only to keep the soil moist, warm, and soft. The result is crops that are more resistant to disease and pests, better tasting, that stay fresh longer, and are more nutritious than those produced by standard industrial farming.

### Curried Butternut Squash Soup La Basse Cour Farm, Harpersfield

4-6 servings

- 4 tbsp butter
- 2 c finely chopped onion
- 4-5 tsp curry powder
- 2 medium sized butternut squash (about 3 lbs)
- 2 Granny Smith apples, peeled, cored, and coarsely chopped
- 3 c chicken stock
- 1 c apple juice
- salt and fresh ground pepper to taste
- garnish: 1 shredded, cored but unpeeled Granny Smith Apple

Melt butter in soup pot. Add onions and curry, and cook over low heat until onions are tender. Peel squash, scrape out seeds and coarsely chop the flesh. When onions are tender, pour in stock, add squash and chopped apples and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer, partially covered, until squash and apples are very tender, about 30 minutes. Puree, add apple juice and season to taste. Simmer briefly to heat through. Garnish individual servings with shredded apple.

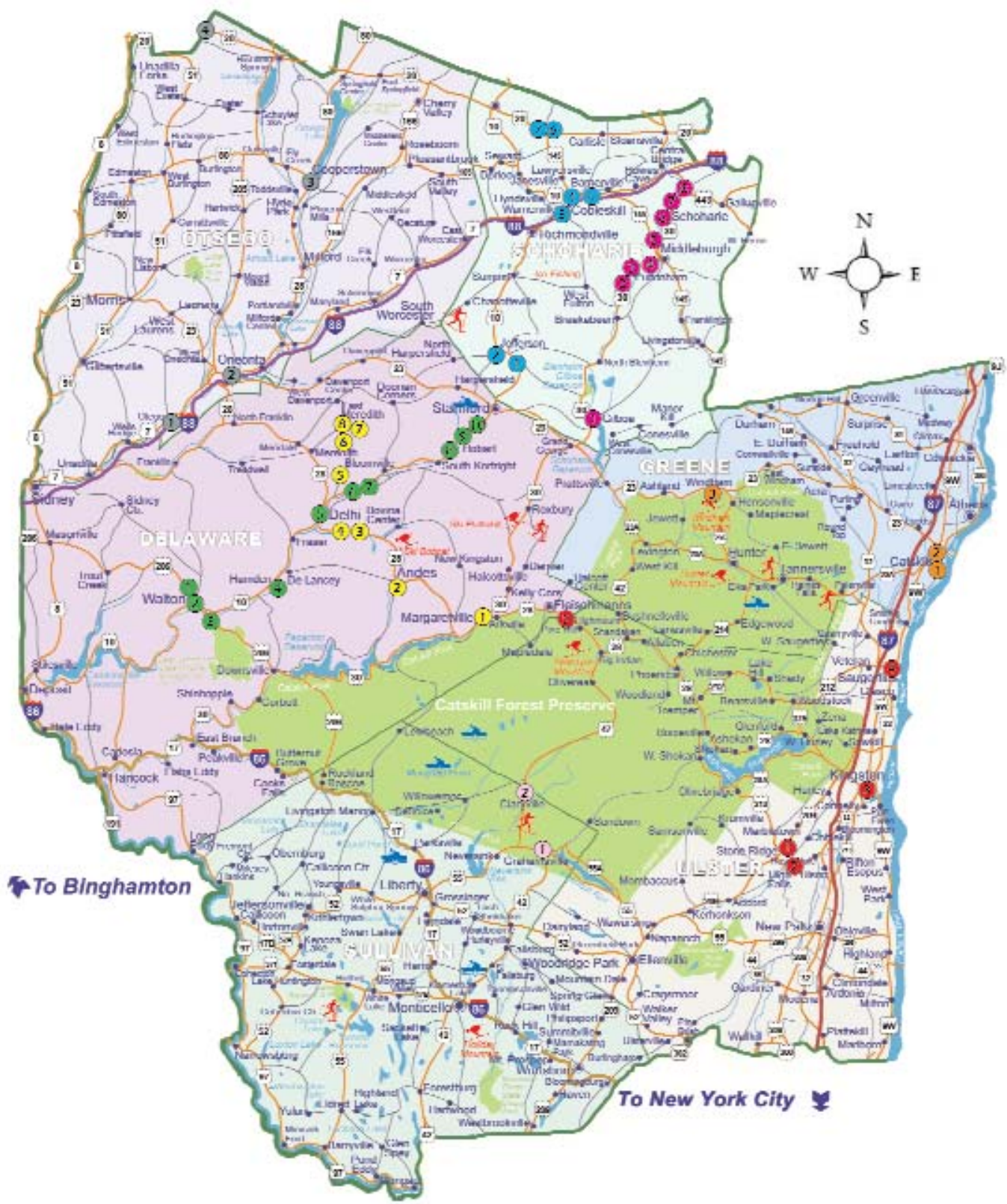

#### Margaretville to East Meredith

On Sundays from May to October, the new **Margaretville Farmers Market** will be open, featuring meats, eggs, produce, and cheeses from local farms. The market will also feature artisans and crafts. The market begins at is open 10am to 3pm. Located at Rt. 28 and Fair Street.

Fuel your morning with a delicious brunch at the **Slow Down Food Company** in Andes (behind Brooke's Variety, open Thursday – Sunday 10-4). Rosalie uses all-local and organic ingredients whenever possible, and sells many of them in her café store.

Heading out of Andes on Rt 28 will bring you to the **Betty Acres Farm Store** (right hand side before Delhi). This stop includes a farm store with local products, and a tour for children, with a pizza garden. Farm tours by appointment with friendly livestock to greet visitors. Visit [www.bettyacresorganic.com](http://www.bettyacresorganic.com) for news and contact information.

Just after Betty Acres Farm is **Burn Ayr Farmstand**. This brand new store offers a variety of plants, vegetables, and many products from local farms and artisans. [www.burnayrfarm.com](http://www.burnayrfarm.com)

In Delhi, turn right towards Stamford on Rt. 10. About 2 miles out of town, turn left onto **Elk Creek Road**—one of the most picturesque back roads you can find anywhere. You'll pass some of the old dairy barns that Delaware County is known for—a picture of dairy farming in days gone by.

At a fork in the road, take the right fork to go to the **West Kortright Arts Centre**. Visit [www.westkc.org](http://www.westkc.org) for a schedule of performances, workshops, and exhibits.

Turn left on West Kortright Church Road and right on Kelso Road to get to **Stone and Thistle Farm**. Tours are on Sundays at 1pm, the farm store is open on other days until 6pm. Visit [www.stoneandthistlefarm.com](http://www.stoneandthistlefarm.com) for more information. Not able to bring grassfed meat home with you? Visit the website of [www.skatecreekfarm.com](http://www.skatecreekfarm.com), also in East Meredith, to place a mail-order.

End your day at the **Hanford Mills Museum**. From Stone and Thistle, head back out on Kelso Road, turn right to go into East Meredith, and right again to visit the Hanford Mills Museum. [www.hanfordmills.org](http://www.hanfordmills.org)

#### Walton to Hobart (Rt. 10)

Start in Walton at **Stony Creek Farm**, located on Freer Hollow Rd, just off the Franklin-Walton road. Pastured poultry and a wide variety of organic vegetables are available direct from this farm. 607-865-7966.

Walton is also home to **East Brook Farm Alpacas**, on Dunk Hill Road, where visitors can watch the alpacas and llamas leisurely graze on green pastures. Check out their website at [www.eastbrookfarms.com](http://www.eastbrookfarms.com). Or stop by **Healing Waters Farm**, one mile west of Walton on Route 206, which features the Little Boy Blue Animal Land and the Walton Carriage Museum. Open Thursday through Sunday. Driving out of Walton east on Route 10 brings you to **Lucky Dog Farm Store**, across from the Hamden Inn. Open Wednesday through Sunday, this restored general store features organic produce from the farm, other organic and local foods, antiques and collectables.

Continue on Route 10 to Delhi for lunch at the **Quarter Moon Café** on Main Street. Chef Jonah Shaw prepares his menu with fresh local ingredients wherever possible. Or bring a picnic lunch to the **Delaware County Historical Society and Museum**, just two miles past Delhi.

Leaving the Museum, you'll come to **Fitch's Bridge**, a wooden covered bridge on your right. Drive over the bridge and turn left on Back River Road to take the scenic route to Hobart through Bloomville and South Kortright. You'll pass a number of small dairy farms, which are still the largest part of the county's agriculture. If you bring along your bike, the old railroad track has been converted to a 30 mile trail for public use, and begins in Bloomville.

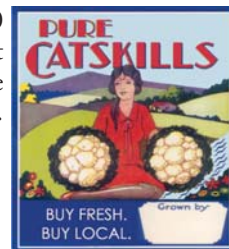

## 2005-2006 GUIDE TO FARM FRESH PRODUCTS



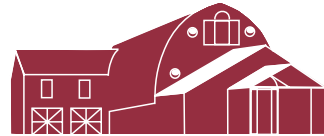
For a good part of the 20th century, the Catskills, in particular Delaware County, grew what was widely considered the best cauliflower anywhere. Mineral-rich soil and a moderate climate with warm days and cool nights that usually allowed slow and solid head development, made this region famous for its premium quality cauliflower. Almost every farm in the region planted some “white gold” to supplement its income. From the 1920s through the 1940s, local cauliflower was shipped in huge quantities via rail and highway to ready markets in New York, Philadelphia and Boston, making the Catskills synonymous with fine quality produce.

Marketing cooperatives, working together to increase efficiency and maximize profit, created distinctive labels for their wooden cauliflower shipping crates, like this one, representing the Walton-Hamden Cauliflower Growers Co-operative, Inc. This label became the symbol for the *Pure Catskills* local marketing initiatives because it exemplifies the long tradition of quality products and a working landscape here in the Catskill Region.
